




# Boundary Reviews



<p><b>Aim</b></p>	<p>To provide a clear understanding of the various types of boundary reviews, the legislation surrounding them and how to successfully conduct them.</p>
<p><b>Objectives</b></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. To identify relevant legislation to enable attendees to comply with the legal and statutory requirements.</li> <li>2. Focusing on Parliamentary constituency boundary and Local Government electoral reviews, to consider the practical implications of undertaking reviews.</li> <li>3. To provide good practice tips and consider effective methods to encourage participation in polling district and polling place reviews.</li> </ol>
<p><b>Audience</b></p>	<p>Electoral administrators and other local authority managerial staff who may have the task of organising and implementing boundary reviews in their authority.</p>

<b>Course Overview</b>	<p>This course will identify the different ways that boundaries may change from parliamentary constituencies down to polling district level. The attendees will be introduced to the legislation and guidance for each type of review. Examples of dealing with boundary anomalies, discussion of local issues and good practice tips all aim to provide a clear understanding of the processes involved.</p> <p><b>Please note:</b> this course will not cover Community Governance Reviews as the AEA run a full day course on that topic.</p> <p>The Course will be delivered using a mixture of presentational material and practical exercises, and with reference to example documentation and official guidance.</p> <p>Group discussion will also take place during the day to facilitate the exchange of knowledge, experience and ideas.</p> <p>Attendees will be provided with a pack on arrival at the course, containing course notes, guidance documents and example materials.</p> <p>Each course runs from 10am until 4pm with breaks for lunch as well as tea and coffee.</p>
