

Key Considerations for Electoral Registration Officers and their Deputies



Aim

To clearly outline all the Electoral Registration Officers' statutory duties and explore how to maximise registration levels.

Objectives

1. Ensure that Electoral Registration Officers and their deputies can identify their statutory duties and the personal nature of their legal responsibilities.
2. Encourage discussion about how to maximise registration and deliver quality electoral registration services at a time of diminishing resources.
3. Equip delegates with an understanding of key electoral processes including: the annual canvass and continuous invitation to register canvassing; and the impact of overwhelming registration and absent vote applications during an election.
4. Create awareness of electoral registration information governance and data sharing..

Who is this course for?

Both newly appointed and experienced Electoral Registration Officers, their appointed Deputies and any accompanying Electoral Service Managers.

Course overview

The course covers key processes to maintain the electoral register: the annual canvass and invitation to register canvassing hearings and appeals, prosecutions for non-responders, information governance and data sharing, absent voting applications, encouraging participation, using social media for target audiences and effective communications.

It will be delivered using a mixture of presentation material and exercises, with reference to example documentation and official guidance. Discussion will be encouraged during the day to exchange knowledge, experience and ideas.

Course notes will be provided.
