Polling districts

s.18 - It is the duty of the council / local authority to divide their area into polling districts for the purpose of

parliamentary elections...

Constituency with 76,000 electors

2,000 electors per polling district

= 38 x polling districts

Not so simple...

Reasonable facilities for voting

- Convenience for voters
- > Transport links
- Community identity


Polling places

Polling Place	Electors
Town Centre primary school	TCE 1 – 1800 TCE 1801 - 3600
Carlton Village Hall	WVA 1 - 1100
Newby College	WVB 1 - 1400
Newby Village Hall	WVC 1 - 900
Tickle Library	WVD 1 - 2000
Newtown Community Centre	NTA 1 - 1600



Polling stations

The RO shall provide a sufficient number of polling stations and allot electors in such manner as he/she thinks convenient...the polling station shall be in the polling place for that district.

Type of review

- Compulsory review
 - every five years
 - > 1 October 2023 31 January 2025
- Interim / partial review
 - must keep districts and places under review
 - > at other times -population growth, boundary changes, etc
 - temporary changes for local elections may not require a review
- ➤Otherwise same processes



To review, or not to review?

- Elections Act 2022
 - accessibility
 - size/space required for paperwork, ID checks
 - ratios allocation of voters and staff
 - private areas / privacy screens
 - > if no longer suitable, you should review



To review, or not to review?

- Polling station/place becomes unavailable before situation of polling stations is published
 - > temporarily review may not be required for local elections
 - permanently full review required for future elections
 - other room available review not required
- Polling station/place becomes unavailable in the immediate run up to polling day
 - special circumstances RO could change without council agreement if election rules allow



Next compulsory review

- 1 October 2023 31 January 2025
 - > 16-month window
- Parliamentary constituencies
 - Boundary Commission's final proposals July 2023
 - once approved, will be used for next general election
- UK Parliamentary General Election
 - By 28 January 2025
 - Autumn 2023? May 2024? Autumn 2024?

Boundary changes

- Boundary changes
 - Community Governance Review
 - Local government review
- Polling district and places review alongside or immediately after the review
- When to publish the register on new boundaries?
 - Ideally, December, splitting polling districts to reflect old and new boundaries
 - If changes order is delayed, old boundaries in December, new in February/March



Stages of review

- Preparatory work
- Notice of review
- (A)RO's proposals
- Consultation
- Prepare final proposals
- Council/committee decision
- Publish outcome
- Adapt and publish register
